Prior to the acceptance of his resignation, as a special mark of recognition and distinction, his services were rewarded by promotion to a seat on the Bench of the Supreme Court.

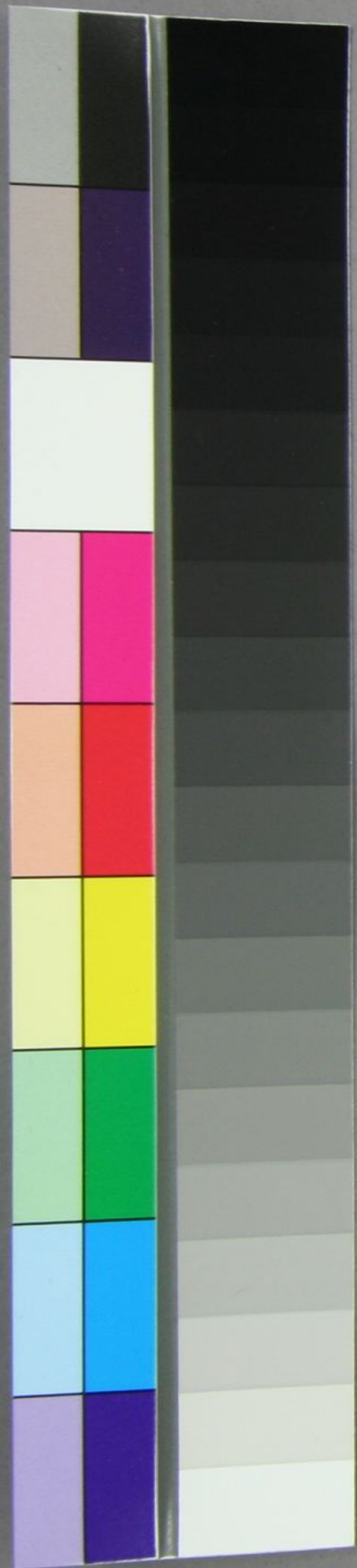
His learning and integrity have earned for him the appreciation of his Government, eminence in his profession, and the esteem of the whole of the Members of the Bench and the Bar.
