Gentle in, Shibo Sanna
2 April 1876

To Mr. J.

Otomo Shigetoku Sanna
Sangi Okumatsuzo.

Sir, I have received a note
from Mr. Jack informing
me that you are engaged
tomorrow - I have named no
other day for receiving me.

As soon as I have left for
England, & it is of some
importance to the government
as to the business I go upon,
I shall be glad to hear from
you whether you decline
to see me, or will kindly
name another day. I have

however no wish to intrude
upon you if you prefer
not to see me. Nothing
but courtesy induced me
to ask for an interview,
for I believe that it is
well that I should inform
you, & the government
through you, of my intentions
with regard to presenting
my claim in the matter
of the Bank of the Rhine,
with the English government
through the British Parliament.
If you are indisposed to
see me on this subject, I

by you will excuse my
having written to you. If you
are willing to receive me, I
will call at such time and
place as you may please
to appoint.
