Teikoku Hotel, Tokio, December 21, 1892

My dear Count Okuma:

I have spoken with General Legendre upon the subject to which you referred, yesterday, and I am happy to inform you that he expressed the most earnest desire to see you, and regrets that the duties upon which he has been engaged for several months have prevented him from visiting you at Waseda. He wishes me to say that he will call upon you within a very few days, and that his pleasure in presenting himself will not be lessened by the circumstance that he is obliged to go as a private individual, wholly unconnected with public affairs. He would write to you himself, if he were not occupied to an unusual extent at this moment, and he sends, through me, the assurance of his sincerest regard.
