His Excellency, Okuma Sango.

Your Excellency, We, having been informed that the Imperial Government of Japan intend ordering the construction of a Pier in Yokohama Bay, of sufficient dimensions to allow of vessels of the largest size mooring alongside, and discharging their cargo on it, have now the honor to apply to Your Excellency for space on the same for loading and unloading the Steamers of the Company, which will be six in number, we paying such charge, as may hereafter be determined upon.

To shew Your Excellency the importance of having sufficient accommodation for the Steamers, we may mention that the "Vasco de Gama" which vessel is expected here on 16th Instant, will have to turn over 4000 Tons of Cargo in 48 hours.

As it is very important ~~that~~ to our Company, to have the Pier speedily constructed, we beg of Your Excellency to request the Officers having the care of the construction of the Pier, to advise us from time to time, as to how the work is progressing.
